Receiving results of your assessments

Once your marks have been released for a piece of assessment, its useful to look not only at the mark but also read through any feedback you have received. Feedback is a great way of learning to improve future assessments. If you have any questions about the feedback you have received we recommend that you contact your tutor.

If you have missed a submission or exam or you have received an assessment mark below the pass mark (Batchelor Degrees/undergraduate courses pass mark = 40, Masters Degrees/Postgraduate courses pass mark = 50), please don't panic, there are processes and regulations that the university puts in place to support you. If this has happened to you, and you have any questions about next steps please speak with your School Office who will be able to advise about restiting and any other support that is available.

Finally, at the end of each academic year, your marks for individual assessments and modules are confirmed by an examboard. Once these have been confirmed they will be released to you along with a decision on how you will progress to the next level of your course, information about any resits you need to undertake or any other conditions of your progression. Look out for emails about your results and if you have any questions please don't heatitate to get in contact with your School Office for further support.
