Guest speaker: Chris Lane

Chris Lane is currently Dean of School of Computing and Digital Media at London Metropolitan University and moved into this role having previously been a Head of Subject, a Head of Partnerships and Employment Outcomes and prior to that Associate Dean for Business Development in the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities, also at London Met.

His current role involves leadership in the area of strategic management, student outcomes, business partnerships, collaborative provision and employability supporting programmes across film, journalism, media, music, games, computer science, communications engineering and mathematics. Prior to this I have led programmes in social work, community development and youth work. Chris has a wide range of interests across the disciplinary areas of media and computing and also leads the University's Charities and Social Enterprise Clinic. He has also

previously undertaken a number of not-for-profit voluntary roles and was an active in student union related work in the 1980s.
